

When Ernie Fancy joined his local section of the Mercedes Benz Club of America in 1976, he didn't realize that the club would become a way of life for him. This year, the Northeast Regional Director and Minuteman Section treasurer celebrates 37 years with the MBCA, making him one of its longest, continuously active members. "It's the people you meet, the conversations you have and the friends you develop," he said about what keeps him involved.

Fancy has owned a 1972 250 sedan, a 1976 300D, a 1969 280SL and a 1960 220SE. Ernie said his favorite car so far is the one he owns now – a 2010 E350. "It's got all the new features," he said. While he originally joined the club to get the inside track on parts and restoration tips, he stayed for other reasons. "I stayed because of the people I met in the club and they did a lot of fun things, a lot of driving events," Fancy said. "We would go to Otis Air Force Base and set up obstacle courses out of pylons, doing timed events, gymkhanas or autocrosses. Doing that, I made a lot of friends."

Fancy went on to become president of the local section – twice – and has held every other office in the Minuteman Section. He was appointed as Northeast Regional Director, serving from 1990 to 1998, overseeing nine sections from Connecticut to Nova Scotia, making site visits, helping with regional events and attending national board meetings. "Anything you can do to help out the clubs," he said.

After relinquishing his Northeast Regional Director title, Fancy returned to his Minuteman Section as the director, the past four years as treasurer. "It gets to be a part of your life," he said. "It's the people you meet, talking about the cars." In fact, it was such a large part of his and wife Bonnie's lifestyle that it became a family affair. When their two boys were young, they would help set up the gymkhanas and the Section's Farber Rallye. "They were always with us in the backseat," Fancy said of his children. "Traveling to events or shows turned into vacations for us. We've gone to a lot more places than we would have and saw more roads that we ever thought we'd see in a lifetime if we didn't do these things." Fancy said he has developed lifelong friendships because of the club. "People move on and we still correspond," he said. "When somebody is interested in the same cars, there is a connection there where to find parts, our trials, our tribulations. Knowing people helps you. They may have a part you need and you learn who and who not to go to. If you like cars, this is a good place to get connected."

"Street Survival Program comes to Saratoga" The real performance was *outside* the Saratoga Performing Arts Center this past weekend, as over 20 young drivers tested their limits, as well as their cars, in the Tire Rack Street Survival program. The program, sponsored by the BMW Car Club of America Foundation, is designed to push young drivers to develop their skills on the road, and to reinforce good motoring habits – especially when parents aren't looking. With over 40 volunteers, there were enough instructors to provide each participant with one on one in-car training.

The action started bright and early as each student carefully inspected their vehicle with supervision from the instructors. Brake pressure was checked, tire pressures topped off, and dipsticks wiped and analyzed before everyone got the go ahead. The first activity of the day lived up to its name – the "wake up drill." Students lined their cars up and one by one accelerated hard to a first set of cones, then braked hard, trying to stop before the second set. Most cars passed the first challenge, with a few students really learning the limits of their anti-lock braking systems.

The students' early morning torpidity quickly gave way to eager smiles as the young drivers clambered out of their cars. Instructors split the drivers into two groups, which began to alternate between interactive classroom discussions and hands-on driving at the test track.

Laid out across the main lot in front of SPAC, the course featured a variety of obstacles that would challenge the young drivers, including a slalom, a lane merging simulation, and a full-size skid pad (the crowd favorite). The slalom featured a series of cones equally spaced apart, requiring the driver to maintain speed while weaving in and out between the cones. The majority of cars used were front-wheel drive sedans, some of which had trouble maneuvering the slalom, however over the course of the day the drivers began to find the cars' limits of understeer.

Nothing demonstrated understeer quite as well as a trip around the very slick skidpad (freshly soaked by fire trucks from the Malta Ridge Fire Department and Milton Fire District #1). The slick pavement helped demonstrate to students the unexpectedness of a loss of grip. Even though your wheels are pointing one way, doesn't mean your car will necessarily follow suit. The students didn't get to have all the fun either. Parents and spectators had a few good laughs watching the students figure things out for themselves. One young driver worked tirelessly to keep his Kia Sedona minivan on course while sliding around the parking lot – all in the interest of learning.

Saratoga Automobile Museum Director of Education, Seth Warden, spoke highly of the program. "It was a no-brainer to bring Street Survival to the museum, it fits our mission to educate, and the kids definitely learned a new skill set." Following an award ceremony and group picture, the students were encouraged to take their parents for a ride on the track to demonstrate what they had learned.

"The best thing about the program is that it teaches students real life scenarios before they happen in real life." The program returns to New York State on July 13<sup>th</sup>, at Monroe Community College, in Rochester.
