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During the past six years the Hudson-Mohawk Section of the Mercedes-Benz Club of America, (HUDMO), has expanded its membership; created more diverse programs for its members; made more charitable donations of money and volunteer time and increased its bottom line. The treasury is at the highest level it has ever been. All of these things were accomplished under the stewardship of Ron Tanner, our president. "I am proud of what the Board and I have been able to accomplish over the past six years", Tanner said.

The admission is \$5,000 for the owner, operator, who must be the driver. \$150,000 will be spent by the organizers of this race. Ron will be bringing along Bob McShane a HUDMO club member as his navigator.

One of Ron's specialties is being the clubs "Rallye Master" so it will be a special treat for him to enjoy being a participant. He has led the club on many driving events, wine tours and very difficult rallies, which have been a great deal of fun for all.

Ron has been a Benz enthusiast for a long time and has owned four of them. Two of them were 450SLs and two are a white 1967 250SL and a green 1968 250SL. He will be driving the 1967 in the great race. He will enter his 1967 250SL in the 2014 Hemmings Concours d"Elegance. Ron has won too many awards to count, but if he wins the "Great Race", he will not only be richer but it will be his proudest achievement.

Before Ron retired from his day job, he ran his own business as a consultant advising clients on the best locations to locate retail businesses. He consulted all over the United States, but in the fifteen years before his retirement he concentrated his efforts only in the North East. We are sure that he used his experience and business acumen to help HUDMO grow and prosper.

Ron said, "While our membership was growing so were the number of friends I have made, for that I will always be grateful. I plan to keep active within the club. I hope to make many more friends at future events".

You might not even notice it as you drive down North Pearl Street on the Northern end of downtown Albany if you weren't paying attention, and that is how they like it. Tucked away on the corner of Tivoli Street in the old industrial neighborhood that once housed many textile mills and various warehouses is a former carriage house that once was home to the horse stables for Freihofer's.

Today this building is home to a different type of horses, specifically the kind of horses that are kept under the hoods of all types of automobiles made in Germany. Rick Dobush bought the building in 1999 in order to house his expanding auto repair business. Not just any type of auto repair however, as suggested by the name of his shop, R&D Automotive: Bavarian Rocket Science focuses his expertise solely on the makes from Duetschland. While he admittedly prefers Porsches for the race track, when it comes to daily drivers he feels nothing beats the quality of vehicles manufactured by Mercedes-Benz, as proven, much to his chagrin, by his daily work horse: a 1989 300E sedan with well over 300k on the mile counter. Other vehicles in his stable include a 1998 Audi A6 station wagon with nearly 500k miles, as well as a spritely BMW 528i barely broken in with just under 90k on her and a few other Porsche road and track project cars.

With over 30 years of experience working with German cars, Rick is well known for sharing his knowledge in various enthusiast circles. Also for nearly 20 years, he has been handing down his knowledge to his nephew, Tom Dobush. Tom now plays a management role at the shop after honing his skills while studying at RPI and working for companies such as Bentley Publishers and Porsche of Boston. Experts when it comes to restoration and preservation of the classics, like the beautiful early 80's 560 SL currently being brought back to life in his shop, to maintenance and repair of modern daily drivers that are becoming ever more sophisticated in our computer controlled world.
